

RESOLUTION FOR DARK-SKY LIGHTING: To help reduce light pollution and to preserve and enhance the visibility of the night sky, Coda Riley proposed adoption of a resolution requiring dark-sky conformant lighting for all new residential construction. Tim Bilberry made the motion to adopt the resolution. Eileen Beard seconded, motion carried:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) for Sportsman's World Property Owners' Association, Inc. (SWPOA) is adopting a "dark-sky lighting" ordinance for all new construction and all enhancements to existing structures. It is the purpose of this ordinance to preserve, protect and enhance the lawful night-time use and enjoyment of any and all property; reduce problems caused by improperly designed and installed outdoor lighting; and minimize adverse effects on residents, vehicle operators and pedestrians, the natural environment, and astronomical observations. It is the intent of this ordinance to encourage "good neighbor" lighting practices and systems that attempt to minimize light trespass and glare from shining onto abutting properties or into street traffic.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the ACC for SWPOA encourages, but does not require, all existing homeowners to comply with the dark-sky lighting ordinance. Basic guidelines for dark-sky lighting:

- Use the lowest wattage lamp feasible
- Make sure all exterior lights point down
- Turn off exterior lights when not in use
- Only use shielded exterior lights
- Use motion sensor controlled exterior lighting
